MES offers a safe haven to the inner city children through empowering children and the youth not to fall victim to their circumstances. This programme invites children and youth to be part of a positive nurturing environment by offering a variety of programmes and encourages a culture of volunteering amongst the youth of South Africa.

SERVICES

- **After School program and Youth Clubs:**
 - Provides learners with educational and recreational support.
 - The Joshuas volunteer their skills to help our children with their homework on a daily basis.
 - Children attending the after school program receive a daily meal.
- **High school youth programme:**
 - Dance school for high school youth focusing on hip-hop and contemporary dance.
 - Professional dance coaches offering dance competitions, musical dance production etc.
 - Weekly youth centre that provides academic support and a safe space for youth to spend their afternoons.
